Use-by dates refer to safety, whereas Best-before refer to quality. Foods with a best-before date should be safe to eat after the date, but use your senses as a guide.

Keeping our rural roads safe



We have had an increase in the number of complaints from concerned residents about stock wandering on roads. We urge all owners of stock to ensure that the management and keeping of stock complies with the rules contained in Council's Bylaws.

- It is the responsibility of every owner of stock to ensure the animals are adequately confined and do not wander onto public property. Check fences regularly.
- An owner of stock is responsible for any damages caused by their animals wandering onto the road; including damage to public or private property, injury of stock, or endangering the health and safety of road users.

Wandering stock may be impounded by Animal Control and all costs associated with the impounding will be recovered from the owner. If the stock is not claimed, it may be disposed of in accordance with the Impounding Act 1955.

MOKAU WATER MAIN PIPE FAILURE

On Friday, 9 September, the Mokau Water Supply system water main along State Highway 3 burst near Rangī Street in Mokau. WDC responded to repair the failed water main.

On Saturday morning, 10 September, WDC was notified of a further loss of supply. WDC investigated and found that another section of the same pipe had burst near the water main pump station. WDC contacted the affected commercial business in Mokau to inform them of the loss of reticulated supply and to provide bottled water. Residents were provided with bottled water where practically possible.

The restoration of the service was delayed because the point of pipe failure was located in proximity to in-ground electricity and telecommunication utility services. Before commencing work these services had to be determined by the utility providers and a street light pole had to be removed. Following this, the pipe was repaired.

We would like to apologise to the residents of Mokau for the inconvenience caused by the temporary loss of water supply. Every effort is being made to ensure that this experience is not repeated. The provision of a reliable water supply for the Mokau community is a top priority for WDC.

Work is already underway to replace this part of the piped water infrastructure in Mokau. During the past year, WDC has been working to install additional shut-off service valves on the Mokau water main that runs under the ground adjacent to State Highway 3 in the township. This work forms part of the mains replacement project that is scheduled for this coming summer. As a result of the recent issues with the water supply mains, this replacement schedule has been brought forward. WDC will commence the project soon and install a new water main along SH3 from the water main pump station to Rerenga Street.

To complete this project, there will be short periods of disruption to the water supply as we connect it to the existing reticulation network. We understand that this will cause further inconvenience, and we ask Mokau residents to bear with us during this time. The resident will be notified directly before the scheduled work.

Any concerns or complaints about the Mokau water supply can be made by phoning 0800 932 4357 – our after hours call centre operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

TAINUI HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Road Tunnels of Taranaki

Tunnels come in all shapes and sizes and Taranaki has its fair share of them. Most were dug by hand and have their own personalities and style.

Since the first tunnel was built in Rome in 36BC, almost 2000 years ago, they have fascinated young and old alike.

And tunnels come with their own jargon - the roof is a crown, the entranceway a portal, the floor is an invert and the sides are sidewalls.

Modern tunnels are usually round because drills make round holes, but generally, those dug with spades have arched roofs because arches are strong and are better for holding up rock.

From the coastal Te Horo Stock Tunnel to the well-used Mount Messenger Tunnel, they tell the stories of industrious men - who took up picks and shovels to improve road conditions long before the invention of tunnel-boring machines.

Take a quick tour through these Taranaki tunnels and don't forget to toot!

The Kiwi Road Tunnels

In 1896, after two settlement blocks were opened up at Rerekapa, an access track called the Tooi was diverted from the Okau Road at Putiki.

Heading south-easterly, it traversed the Putiki Valley before following a ridge along the wall of the Tongaporutu Valley.

In 1900, the track was widened to 2m so Rerekapa settlers could carry in supplies but the make-do road was often impassable in winter.

It continued to be used until 1916, when a new road, the Kiwi, was put in to provide better access. After the Kiwi Road opened, the Tooi became redundant.

Whether tunnels were included in the original plans is not known, but tunnelling began on the Eastern Kiwi Tunnel in 1913 and took two years to complete.

When finally, the road opened again, it allowed wheeled traffic into the valley for the first time.

The Eastern Kiwi Road Tunnel is quite plain; just a half-round hole in a bank.

The Western Kiwi Rd Tunnel is a handsome structure by comparison, with a steeply pitched roof and rafters at each end that don't travel its whole length.

Today, both tunnels and road remain much as they did back in the days when they were built.

Surrounded by bush, the road from the Okau through to Rerekapa is still one of the most picturesque anywhere in Taranaki, though few people even know it exists.
