

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE MUSEUM

Tēnā koutou katoa

On the 11th hour of the 11th month 1918 the truce was signed that ended WW1. Armistice Day will be commemorated at the Museum with the reading of some stories some local children have written about their ancestors going off to war. Come down at 10:45am on Wednesday the 11th and listen to the sacrifice made by some.

November 20 is World Children's Day and within many cultures ancient history had not always placed a high value on its children. The UN sort to alter this mindset by adopting a resolution to establish a Universal Day of the Child in 1954, promoting the ideals and objectives of the UN Charter and the welfare of the children of the world. This day also celebrates the day of which the Assembly adopted the Rights of the Child in 1959 and the Conventions of the Rights of the Child in 1989. Let us take the day to change something for the positive for the children of our community. They will endure what we establish today. By the way, did you see the school art displayed in the gallery last month. There is some real talent among us.

Did you know that the museum has over 4000 items? Over the past 4 years museum staff have been working on a audit of the collection, documenting the many artefacts and archives, registering them on a national database. While this work is never really completed, the project is coming to an end and the team are preparing for the next significant project that will enhance the collection. Funding is a constant challenge as there are always more ideas than funds. There are many contributors to the museum and I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank Fulton Hogan for the funding of a new hot water system, Lotteries Community Matters for their contribution to our storeroom shelving and Te Papa for their contribution to the governance review. These along with many others help us keep the museum resourced and relevant. Ngā mihi nui.

I would like to welcome our new volunteers Prue, Anita and Mark. The contribution of your time makes a huge difference to the museum and the wider community. The museum is now open 7 days from 10-4pm throughout the summer and we are always on the lookout for more helpers. The roster is broken up into 3-hour slots and it's a great way to connect with people. If this is something you can help with Jennifer for love to hear from you.

Finally, in reflection of our tamariki and mokopuna, "Tangata ako ana i te kāenga, te tūranga ki te marae, tau ana". A person nurtured in the community contributes strongly to society.

MOKAU COAL

AN UNTOUCHED CROP SOURCE OF CHEAP FUEL

(Taranaki Daily News - 25 November 1920)

Are the enormous deposits of coal which the residents of Mokau say run from that river back to Huntly really buried behind £100,000 worth of snagging of the Mokau river, or is it the war cry of interested parties?

The president of the Taranaki Chamber of Commerce (Mr E Webster) and Mr Gordon Fraser, a member of the Council, last week made a pilgrimage to Mokau to investigate and they come back with enthusiastic reports of the possibilities of cheap coal for Taranaki.

The quality of Mokau coal is well known in this district, and though, through floods, the old mines some years ago were, unfortunately, cut off from steamer communication, it is not generally known that other fields exist about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles inland from a point situated about 14 miles up the river. At the kind invitation of the Mokau Harbour Board the delegates were afforded an opportunity of exploring the field. Leaving Mokau early in the morning, they enjoyed to the full, the delightful panorama unfolded of the magnificent bush clad banks of the Mokau river, which they say deserves to be better known to the tourist. The metalling of Mt Messenger and the bridging of Mokau river would bring Mokau within two hours motor run of New Plymouth, then this should be a favourable trip.



HANDY TIPS FOR AROUND HOME

One job that many of us must do over the summer is to get the wood to keep us warm for the winter. Wood that is not properly dry provides less energy and soot's up the flu. A woodshed can be as flash as you want it, but must provide 2 functions, one is to keep the rain off and the other is to enable good air flow. A good sturdy pallet makes a great floor, wall off on the windward side with a good gap at the bottom and use wooden slats on the leeward side with good gaps in between, or another pallet. To prevent the shed from being too dark put a sheet of Clearlite in the roof. This will create a well-lit, well ventilated, and dry shed that will condition your wood over the summer for the best available energy within it.

But before you light the first fire in 2021 you must clean your flu. Invest in a chimney brush from your favourite hardware store for \$60 or get someone in to do it for you. Best time to do it is after the last fire this year, so it is all clean ready to go when you need it

From Your Councillor

At our Audit, Risk, & Finance Committee meeting on 13 October, we reviewed and recommended our draft 2019/2020 Annual Report for approval at the Council Meeting planned for 27 October.

Despite the effects of the COVID shut down on Councils operations, it appears we will achieve a surplus of \$4.6m (c.f. forecast of \$5.1m) before Capital Expenditure, which amounted to only \$6.1m of the budgeted \$12.4m.

Our actual borrowings are now down to \$37.3m, slightly less than in 2010, but after hitting a peak of \$47.0m in 2012, a reduction of \$10.0m over the last eight years.

Of our total revenue of \$34.0m (\$33.6m last year), rates make up \$20.7m (\$20.4m last year), so rates fund 60% of our operations.

Of our operating expenditure of \$28.5m, Roads & Footpaths took \$10.4m (36%),

Community Services \$4.2m (14%), Water Supply \$2.8m (9%), Sewerage \$2.7m (9%), and Solid Waste \$2.3m (8%), with the rest spread over five other Activities.

All of this was achieved with only 71 full time equivalent employees.

We are presently working hard with our staff to set up our next Long Term Plan (2021-2031), but there is huge uncertainty ahead over the potential demands on Local Government by Central Government. The Three Waters Programme involves the Government aspiration of all Water, Waste Water, & Storm water, management and operation being taken over by a small number of regional organisations, along the lines of Watercare.

The NPSs for Freshwater and Indigenous Biodiversity currently have high expectations of Local Government oversight, with little suggestion of funding assistance at this stage.

There is a suggestion now that Government will push for a greater involvement from Local Government in the provision of support for social assistance with housing, employment, and some welfare services. So there is potential for a lot of changes in Local Government as we presently know it.






